WINTER ILLS!

It is timely with winter coughs and colds around that we remind families about the spread of viruses. If your child is unwell please keep them home, away from their other classmates and staff, until they are better.

SCHOOL HATS

Our Sunsmart Policy states that from 1 June until 31 August (winter months), except when the UV level is below 3, it is not compulsory



for students to wear sunsmart hats. The Cancer Council of SA recommends that children don't wear them during winter because they need to be exposed to the sun to get vitamin D.

A note from Maressa Derry our Student Welfare Worker

Good luck to all our children who do NAPLAN this week.

Don't run from a challenge. Instead run toward it because the only way to escape fear is to trample it beneath your feet - *Nadia Comaneci*

Anxiety is more than just feeling stressed or worried. While stress and anxious feelings are a common response to a situation where we feel under pressure, they usually pass once the stressful situation has passed, or 'stressor' is removed.

Anxiety is when these anxious feelings don't go away – when they're ongoing and happen without any particular reason or cause. It's a serious condition that makes it hard to cope with daily life. Everyone feels anxious from time to time, but for someone experiencing anxiety, these feelings aren't easily controlled.

When a child has anxiety, we may think he/she just has a behavior problem. Anxiety is a situation in our mind that people cannot see and we may not even know we have, but it makes us respond in ways that don't seem very thoughtful to ourselves or to others.

Understanding the nature of anxiety is extremely important. A loss of emotional control can negatively impact a child's success with all relationships throughout all environments.

If you would like to know some more about this, I can recommend the books "When My Worries Get Too Big!" A relaxation book for children who live with anxiety. Written and illustrated by Kari Dunn Buron.

Active kids are smarter kids.


Now in its 20th year, the annual campaign and community event




encourages all primary school children, their parents and carers to walk and commute regularly and safely to school.
