SRC will be going to classrooms selling tickets.

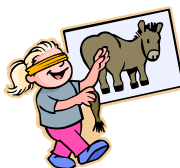
20 cents per ticket – limit 25 tickets per child.

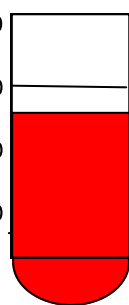
