COVID-19

We are extremely grateful to the parents who have at all times followed SA Health, State and our school guidelines around keeping all students safe. There has been some welcomed positives from the restrictions that have been in place:

- We are noticing that the students are not as tired and more attentive as they are not involved in as many after hours activities
- Our younger students are much more independent in the mornings and as a result they are in control
 of their belongings at all times during the day. Many parents have also commented on the change they
 have seen from their child and how they are doing things they would never expected a few months ago

Non-contact infrared thermometers

Our school has been issued with a non-contact infrared thermometer. Please note: As advised in the SA Health guidelines we will NOT be doing universal testing of our students. The thermometer will however, be used when a student presents unwell to the sick bay with fever like symptoms e.g. flushed skin, aching muscles, chills or shivering. Their temperature will be taken without any contact to the body surface. Taking only a few seconds to give an accurate reading, the thermometer will enable us to give parents more accurate information about the symptoms their child is presenting.

It is also pertinent at this time to remind parents not to send their child to school if they are unwell.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD)

The NCCD is an annual collection of information about Australian school students with disability. The NCCD enables schools, education authorities and governments to better understand the needs of students with a disability and how they can best be supported at school. Currently our teachers are busily working on student reports. As we missed a number of weeks of schooling during the initial phase of the Covid Crisis we have not been able to collect quality assessment for all curriculum areas. Once this takes place, we will invite parents who did not manage to meet with their child's classroom teacher in term one to arrange a time to discuss their child's progress.

YEAR 7 TO HIGH SCHOOL UPDATE:

As you may know, year 7 is moving to high school in 2022. This means that if your child is in year 5 or 6 this year, they will graduate from primary school next year. Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 
