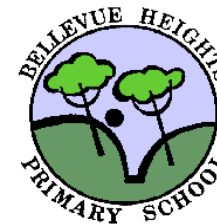


2021 Materials and Services Charge

At the next Governing Council meeting, which will be held on Monday 26th October 2020 at 7.00pm in the Bellevue Heights Primary School Activity Hall, the 2021 Materials and Services Charge will be approved. Parents who would like to discuss the fees are welcome to attend the meeting. In lieu of attendance at the meeting, parents can express their views in writing to the Chairperson of the Governing Council to reach the school by 3pm on Friday 23rd October 2020. The charge proposed for 2021 is \$370 which is above the standard sum. 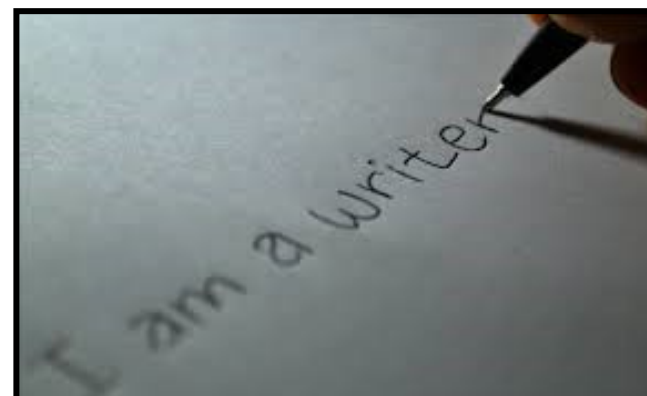

Term 3 is data collection term. The teachers have been very busy over the past 3 or so weeks collecting information about how our students are progressing in their learning. This has meant that the children have been undertaking different kinds of assessments. The information we get from this data collection is essential in planning our teaching and learning experiences for the future. It also gives teachers a snap shot of how well each child is progressing and how to help them continue to grow in the future. The students have participated

in the PAT-Reading and PAT-Mathematics tests (these were online), written their latest narrative and persuasive texts for Brighpath assessment, taken the SA Spelling Test and continued with Running Records. If your child has come home tired, this is probably why!
