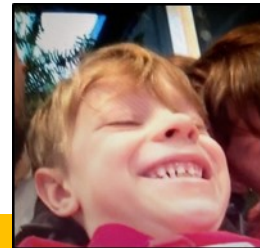
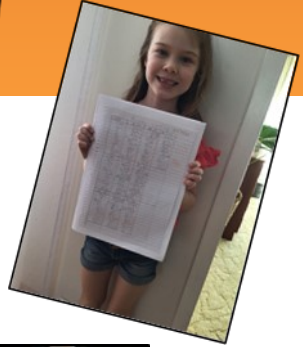
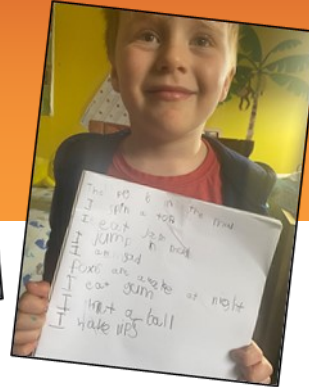

## Room 3 R/1 class

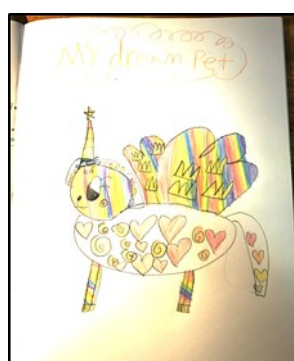
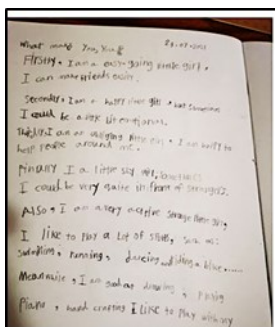
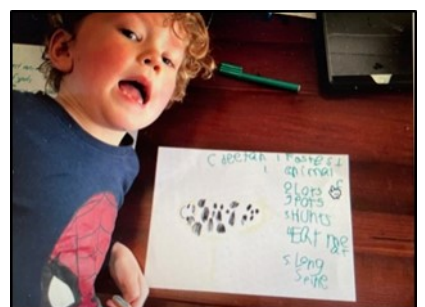
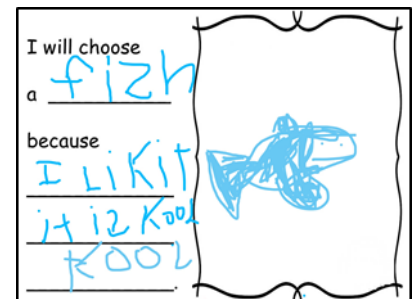


In this challenging time children have been learning at home and sharing some of their experiences via the Seesaw app and email.

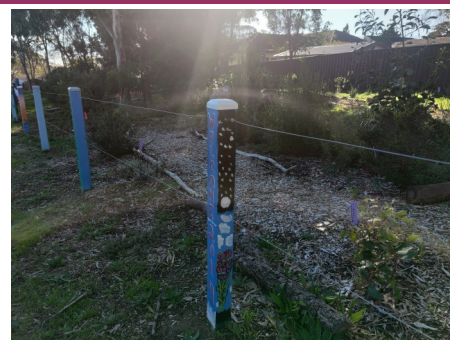
