HOUSF KFFPING - Term 1

Students should not be arriving before 8.40 in the mornings. Doors open at 8:50am and school begins at 9:00am. Students who do arrive before 8:40am are asked to sit on the benches by the school office.

School finishes at 3.30pm and whilst there is general supervision in the yard until 3:50pm, we would encourage all children to picked up as soon as possible. All children who are not collected by 3.50 must remain in the front office or area near the admin building. Children must be supervised by parents if they are staying in the yard to play after 3.50 pm. We do realise that sometimes delays are inevitable but all children should be collected by 3.50pm or booked into OSHC.

We have an excellent OSHC service and Mira would be very happy to chat with you about your before school and/or after school needs.

Our yard is a very busy place before and after school and we therefore remind you that students are allowed to play but bicycles and scooters should be wheeled, and dogs should be controlled by a leash.

Parking and Drop Off

Darking Deminders

With the commencement of the new school term Mitcham Council have advised the school they will be patrolling parking areas on a regular basis. Below are some reminder of some of our local traffic conditions near the school.

⇒ NO PARKING ZONE - You may stop in a No Parking zone to immediately pick up or set down your child, and drive off as soon as possible. You can only stop for 2 minutes and be no further than 3 meters from your car in this zone. No Parking zones are to ensure a quick and smooth turnover of vehicles. Arrange with your child the exact place and time you will pick them up





- \Rightarrow NO STOPPING ZONES North corner of Vaucluse Cres. You must not stop your vehicle in a no stopping zone or on a solid yellow line, not even for a few seconds.
- ⇒ Traffic speed outside school zone is 25km
 - Vaucluse Cres is 'one way' at the beginning and end of the school day.
- ⇒ Avoid double parking at all times.
- ⇒ Children must not alight your car until you are legally parked.
- ⇒ CAR PARK IS FOR STAFF ONLY
- ⇒ Alternate parking is available at the Clearvision Church at the rear of the school. See office staff for more

School Card

WHAT IS SCHOOL CARD?



School Card provides financial help to cover the cost of school fees.

WHO CAN APPLY?

To qualify for School Card, your family's income must be below a specific limit. This limit depends on how many children are in your care.

You must **also** meet at least one of the following:

- have a child or children aged four years or over who attend a school full time
- be an independent full-time student studying year 10, 11 or 12
- be an adult re-entry student undertaking subjects to complete SACE (years 11 and 12).

HOW WILL I KNOW IF I AM APPROVED?

After you apply, you will receive a letter in the mail advising if your application has been approved. Please note, School Card is not a student identification card.
