Autism Inclusion Teacher:

Many of you may have heard about the initiative of providing an Autism Inclusion Teacher for every public primary school in South Australia. At Bellevue, Mrs Kirsty Whibley has been appointed as our Autism Inclusion Teacher. You may know Kirsty as an exceptional early year's teacher. She is currently teaching Reception / Year one in Room 5. Kirsty will work in this role 1 day per fortnight. Initially, Kirsty will build her own teaching expertise, knowledge and understanding of autism through engaging in formal learning offerings and participation in the Autism Inclusion Teacher networks. To improve knowledge and practice across the school, Autism Inclusion Teachers will then be encouraged to share their learnings and resources with their colleagues to utilise when teaching autistic children and young people in their own classes.

It is not Kirsty's role to work 1:1 with students with Autism. Students will continue to be supported through existing structures and processes. For more information about improving support for autistic children and students please visit the Department for Education website.

NAPLAN:

Next week some of our students will take part in the NAPLAN online practice test. The formal tests will take place in weeks 7 and 8. The practice test helps to ensure that the platform will work when large groups of students log on to the system. It does not affect the actual NAPLAN test results. I think it is important to remember that NAPLAN gives teachers, students and families important information about student performance, but it is only one way that schools collect data. We want to be mindful that there is so much more to students than their performance on a test. Courage, risk taking, creativity, cooperation, empathy, reasoning, kindness – none of these qualities can be measured by a test – and are things we want to encourage in our children.



Oliphant Science Awards



The Oliphant Science Awards are a wonderful opportunity for school students to develop their interests in science through a range of categories to suit a wide variety of abilities and interests.

Students must enter in the appropriate year level but may enter any category (or in multiple categories) as many times as they wish. (But focus on quality over quantity!)

Year levels: R-2, 3-4, 5-6

Categories:

- Citizen Science new for 2023
- Crystal Investigation
- Games
- Models & Inventions (sponsored by the Australian Institute of Energy)
- Multimedia
- Photography (sponsored by SA Museum)
- Posters
- Programming, Apps & Robotics (sponsored by Defence Science and Technology Group)
- Scientific Inquiry (sponsored by the University of South Australia)
- Science Writing (sponsored by Flinders University)

Students can enter as an Individual or in a group. Only individual students can enter Posters or Science Writing.

Students may enter all other categories as individuals or in groups of 2 or 3 students (maximum).

Class / school groups may enter the new Citizen Science category.

Registration:

By registering, all entrants agree to the conditions of entry. Students must register their entries through their school's SASTA Oliphant Science Awards Coordinator (Eric Nicholson). All registrations are due by close of business Friday 19 May.

There is plenty of time to think of an idea and get started. More information will be sent out as we get closer to the close of registrations. Please note that this is something students complete in their own time, but please feel free to contact Eric for clarification about the process.
