Dear Families,

Well—it has been a very eventful couple of weeks. I feel like we have lived an entire term in the last 4 weeks. I think the decision to move out of the JP block has taken a lot out of us, but we are now settled and things are continuing smoothly. My hat is off to all of our teachers and SSOs as they have taken every opportunity to work together as a team to transition across to new spaces, adjust to limited rooms, and have helped each other at every turn. It hasn't been easy but I really want to acknowledge how hard they have worked to do all of this within a very short timeframe.

I walked down the corridor of the administration building on Wednesday and counted 5 groups of students in 5 separate little offices, all taking part in intervention or music lessons - which used to take part in the classroom spaces. We are indeed crowded, but we fit and we will be striving to continue to keep every program running as seamlessly as possible.

This week also saw our Robocup teams compete at the State Competition. This is something I have been highly involved in running for the last 10 years, slowly expanding the program. I would like to acknowledge the commitment of Laura Bowman this year as she assisted me and learned how to run this. This year we had a record 32 students compete in 8 separate teams. Until you are involved, it is hard to see the amount of effort that the students put into this. Approximately 10 weeks of double lessons and after school practice including a full day in the holidays and countless lunch times saw teams navigate design, planning, programming, building, construction, decoration, testing, testing and more testing until they were ready to perform or compete in their division.

This year we had 4 teams enter the "On Stage" competition - we gained First, Second and Third place this year - never have we had such success! We had 3 teams enter the "Rescue" division resulting in many challenges and modifications along the way. One team finished with a second place in the state. Well done! We also had one team enter the Sumo Challenge. They learned so much and were very competitive at the end of the day. Well done on your resilience!

<u>Student</u> <u>Representative Council</u> <u>(SRC)</u>


At Bellevue, each class has 2 elected Student Representatives and one from OSHC. These students are elected thoughtfully e.g. through nominations, speeches, votes etc and are relied on by their classmates to take their views to fortnightly meetings.

At each meeting, our SRC

Executive Members (Year 6 Leadership) give each rep the opportunity to share concerns and to make decisions regarding their experiences at school. Some of the issues raised include: the following of rules, the fairness of the soccer space, use of bins, greening of our school and events for students.

Last term one of the issues raised was the student desire for a disco, which was provided by the SRC Executives at the end of term 2. Many rules and reminders have come through the SRC.

This term reps have noted that trees do not have clear markings for climbing anymore, so together, they have conducted a tree audit, selecting the trees that were strong enough, shaped well and had soft space underneath. These trees will soon be re-marked so that students know which ones are suitable for climbing. The markers will indicate the height that students feet may go.






Room 19's Invisible Buckets
