

Christmas/Holiday Tableaux, Green Screen & Animation

(Media Arts, Drama)

Students will use dramatic skills of tableaux and facial expression to form part of an animated media artwork creation depicting the Christmas or holiday season using various media technologies. Students will use iPads, green screen technology, and various apps to develop skills in photographing, editing, exporting, importing and animation techniques. Students will collaborate and create digital animations to accompany a still image, creating and presenting a media artwork to share with their class and family.



Fruity Music

(Integrated Music/Drama/Dance)

- Students will explore beat, rhythm and basic music composition and notation using a range of hands-on activities based on the book "Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?" by Bill Martin Jr and Eric Carle.
- Students will extend and adapt the learning from "Brown Bear" to create beats and rhythms using the syllables from play fruit and vegetables.
- Students will use singing, body percussion and non-melodic instruments to build upon their knowledge each week using Orff Schulwork pedagogy.

Music/Movement – Body Percussion & Non-Melodic Percussion Instruments/Objects

Music is taught using the Orff Schulwerk pedagogy, using an integrated approach with movement and using techniques such as exploration, echo imitation, whole class/small group/individual activities, discussion, peer review, and reflection. Students will explore beat, rhythm, tempo, and dynamics through body percussion, hand clap sequences, and various non-melodic percussion instruments. The unit will culminate with students working in small groups to create an 8-beat passing routine using a variety of props/instruments.
